Explosive Testimony in the Harrow Case

Things got heated at the NC Court House yesterday, as the former Lawman accused of multiple crimes, including extortion, bribery, and attempted murder faced the prosecution's main witness. The witness, also a Lawman, learned of the crimes of the accused, and claimed the accused was working in tandem with other Lawmen in a band of corrupt police. The defendant lawyer became incensed, and the accused exploded at the witness, promising retribution in a profanity filled tirade that halted the trial for over fifteen minutes. "It looks bad for him", said an anonymous individual watching the trial, "In his shouting match, he mentioned nothing of being innocent, and all of his defenses are technicalities the accused are trying to exploit and make bigger than they are. The jury does not appear to be on board with them thus far, and tomorrow isn't likely to sway them".
